The online service, Monitoring Teacher Education provides data on teacher education in Germany for experts and stakeholders and aims at making structures of teacher education transparent and clear. Monitoring Teacher Education

- 16 federal states have their own guidelines.
- Every federal state has it own type of schools.
- Teachers are specifically educated for each of these school types.
- 71 higher education institutions design their curricula autonomously.
- In 2015 56 universities had a centre for teacher education.
- The higher education institutions in the federal states are increasingly collaborating.
- Teacher education is in a continuing process of development.
